I'm so excited to meet you all and get to know you – I just know this is going to be a great year with a wonderful senior high youth group!

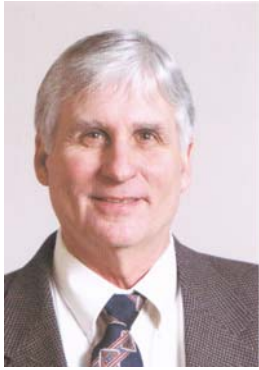

“Keys for God's Kingdom” Organ Fund Drive

As you know, our current organ is on it's “last note.” As a supplemental way of raising money for this organ, we are running the “KEYS FOR GOD'S KINGDOM” campaign through from now until March 2011. Sure-nuff, Christ the King, Love your Neighbor, Corn Bread and Ice Tea, Kind of Ministry

I believe that most people deep inside have a good heart. I don't mean physically, but morally. We at Christ the King have good hearts. A year or so ago, I met a woman that spoke at the Optimist Club, which I belong to, and she spoke about her school for autistic children. She talked about these kids with a true concern and love for them and for their families. Her name is Jessica Pugh. I could not forget about her visit or about the needs of her school. A few months ago I decided to call her to see how she was doing and invited her to speak to our Outreach team meeting to tell us more. She met with us and told us that the school has changed to a non-profit and has been renamed **The North Georgia Children's Center**. If you have driven up Highway 9 toward Coal Mountain, you have passed by the school on the left - almost a stone's throw from our church! The school educates students with autism and those with other learning disabilities. She supplied us with a wish list of items needed. Some of the items were small things like puzzles and games for the kids and a few were more expensive like a concrete pad for basketball and for help repairing a leaky roof.

I personally want this to be a permanent and long-term ministry for all of us. This could be a great addition to the youth education and ministry. Pastor Seyward, Bob and June Wolsin, and Dottie and I met with Jessica on Thursday, July 15, to tour her facility and assess some of the needs she has. Future plans are for a new building to be built, but in the meantime, there is much work to be done to assure that these students are learning in a safe environment. I don't feel that Jessica is asking for a hand out as much as God is telling us to do what people should do. We are instructed by God to love our neighbors. SPARK: Activate Faith

For children ages 3 through 5th grade

Following the resignations in May of our Children's Ministry Directors, Mr. and Mrs. Scott and Janet Wullstein, many members of our congregation have stepped up to offer their time and talents in providing quality children's ministry. Nearly 70 adults and older teens gave of their time to provide a wonderful VBS experience, "Baobab Blast."

This summer an Education Steering Committee was formed to continue to plan and implement our 2010 – 2011 Sunday School Program. In the interim Senior Pastor Kerry Maurer will be overseeing the children's ministry of our congregation. Cheryl Milejczak, Laurie Feinzig, Valerie Homer, Kathy Voerg and Pastor Seyward Ask are serving as the directors of the committee. As always if you are interested in serving on the committee please contact Pastor Kerry. More participation is always welcome.

Our Sunday School program will be centered in the Augsburg Fortress rotation curriculum, "**SPARK: Activate Faith.**" Spark is a Bible-centered curriculum built on traditional Christian values. To learn more about SPARK please see the website at www.activatefaith.org.

- Spark is for children who are at least 3 years old through 5th grade.
- All parents with participating children are asked to give at least three (3) Sundays a year to help.
- Think of these classes as thematic units—try to attend all of the Sundays in each unit.

Year 1: Fall 2010

Rotation 1: **CREATION** (August 15 – September 5):

Main Bible Point: "God Created everything ... and it is good!"

Rotation 2: **THE FIRST SIN** (September 12 – October 3):

Main Bible Point: "God loves us even when we fail."

Rotation 3: **JOSEPH AND HIS BROTHERS** (October 10 – 31)

Main Bible Point: "Learning to forgive each other."

Rotation 4: **JOSEPH AND PHARAOH** (November 7 – 28)

Main Bible Point: "God working through us."

Rotation 5: **JESUS IS BORN** (December 5 – 19)

Main Bible Point: "The Greatest Gift of All!"

If you are interested in learning more about this curriculum, there will be a meeting on Sunday, August 8, immediately following the 11:00 a.m. service. This will be an information and training session for the volunteers that have already signed up. We welcome all who would like to learn more about this program.

In addition classes will be held each Sunday of the Sunday School Schedule for middle school and senior high ages. We ask all youth and children to be pre-registered by going to our website, www.ctklutheran.com, click on "Enroll Now" located by the Sunday School hour and filling in the form.

Faith In Action

On the week of Saturday, July 17, I was given the opportunity to go with a special group



called FCA (Fellowship of Christian Athletes) down to the Dominican Republic on a baseball missionary trip. While we were down there we went to little towns called "sugarcane villages" because surrounding these tiny villages were acres of just sugarcane. These villages were extremely poor and had very little or no food and water. I think seeing this first hand is what affected me the most. We went to a local supermarket called Jumbo (think of a small Wal Mart) and bought food, water, toys and supplies to distribute to these villages as well. As we pulled into these villages, they were always very excited to see us and we were always instantly surrounded by young boys and girls yelling "Americanos!" We also visited two orphanages, one being a special needs orphanage. We spent quality time with these children, which also had a tremendous affect on me. All of these visits got me to realize how truly blessed I am. We played baseball games with the local teams on their homemade fields and then when we got done we all gathered around our interpreter to share the Gospel with the villages. It was very touching when I saw the kids and even some of the older villagers raising their hand to accept Christ into their lives for the first time. I also spoke to a group of Dominican and American baseball players, giving my testimony about how I accepted Jesus into my life and how doing this has greatly helped me. After every session we handed our Spanish Bibles to the villages to keep. I look forward to doing the trip again next year because it was such a life changing experience.

Every Little Bit Helps

What's five dollars? Considering today's economy and the value of the dollar, five dollars is diddly-squat. If you order carefully, you could probably get a decent meal at a fast food restaurant, but you won't get into a movie unless it's a senior-citizen matinee. At many restaurants, five dollars wouldn't even buy you an appetizer. Let's face it; a five-dollar bill is hardly worth the effort. While there are still some people who wouldn't hesitate to bend down to pick up a "lucky" penny, most people walk past nickels and dimes without giving them much thought. We have more important things to do than to mess around with loose change.

But what about that five-dollar bill? If you saw one lying in our church parking lot, would you reach down and pick it up? Would you then shout "Finders keepers, losers weepers!" and stick it in your pocket? Or would you look at it as "free" money and drop it in the offering plate?

Has it occurred to you that every Sunday the Fellowship Hall is loaded with "free" five-dollar bills waiting to be picked up and dropped in the offering plate? Five percent is the average discount we've been earning on the sale of gift cards. For every one hundred dollars worth of scrip sold, the church realizes a profit of five dollars. Thus, if you and your family are among the majority of our members who have failed to participate in this program, you are walking past those five-dollar bills.

Through the first ten months of the Scrip Program, approximately fifty families have become regular users of gift cards. The average participating family is buying about \$450 worth of cards every month and thus "picking up" four or five of those "free" five-dollar bills. As a result, we're netting almost \$1,100 per month to help pay down our debt.

It's amazing how those five-dollar bills can add up!

How much does your family spend each month for groceries, gasoline, clothing, home improvement products, and entertainment such as movies and eating out? If all our families used gift cards for these basic necessities, we could easily double or triple the number of five-dollar bills dropped in the offering plate.

Stop by the Fellowship Hall this Sunday and grab a few of those five-dollar bills. Every little bit helps.
