Qualities of a Leader

This month we offer our thanks to three members of our congregation council as they end their terms of service. Mike Miller has served two terms (four years) as our Financial Officer, Scott Younghouse has served two terms as member-at-large, and Linda Forbes has served one term (two years) as member at large. Mike and Scott are not eligible for another term and Linda has chosen not to seek another term. These three leaders have provided excellent leadership to our congregation, and we owe them a great debt of gratitude. Be sure to thank them next time you see them!

As we prepare to elect new leaders to our congregation council I want to take a few moments to outline what I believe are the key elements to being a church leader. I believe firmly that a church leader is not a popular election of name recognition or even longevity of membership. I believe that being a church leader is a calling from God. It is a call to use our spiritual gifts in the highest calling possible. Some of the qualities that I look for in a church leader are:

Effective leaders are faithful. They are loyal to God, their families, and to their church where they serve. They are faithful in worship and in giving, both financially and in sharing their time.

Effective leaders are joyous and fun. One of the main reasons that leaders are effective is because they have eager followers. People like to follow leaders who are fun and demonstrate obvious joy in their lives. Who wants to follow a grumpy, joyless leader?

Effective leaders have a strong work ethic. In fact, one of the greatest challenges of these leaders is maintaining balance. They are prone to be on the task 24/7.

Effective leaders take initiative. These leaders do not need to be prodded to complete a task. To the contrary, they go well beyond others' expectations. Good managers complete an assigned task. But good leaders are regularly envisioning a better way and better strategy.

Effective leaders love people. Some effective leaders are extroverts; they are energized when they are around people. Other effective leaders are introverts. Put them in a crowd sharing small talk, and they will be drained by the end of the day. But both types of leaders have a love for people. They truly care about others. They embody servanthood.

Effective leaders are tenacious. You rarely hear about them giving up. While others may view a setback as failure, effective leaders see it as an opportunity to move in another direction.

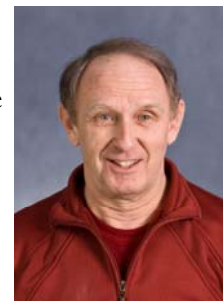

Food For Thought Project

The Food for Thought Project is a community based, ongoing, food collection program that will help supply *local* food banks on a continuing basis. The program was launched in April 2011 and currently there are about 218 Forsyth County residents participating.

How does it work?

A bright orange bag is delivered to participants who are asked to buy one extra non-perishable item on their weekly grocery trips and place it in the bag. On the 2nd Saturday of every other month, a volunteer will pick up the bag at your doorstep, replace it with a new one, and deliver the food to one of our local food pantries. We believe this program will be highly successful in Cumming and Forsyth County because it is simple and we make it easy for people to contribute. The more people that participate, the more food collected for those in need.

How can I participate?

Participation is easy. Go to the website, fftpinc.org and click on the tab, "Sign Up." The website will also give ideas on what types of food are needed.
